Outdoor Education Camp at Colo.

The Year 9 Challenge Camp is a demanding and exciting one. Activities include rock climbing, mountain biking, self-reliance in cooking and cleaning, group problem solving initiatives, the adventure ropes course, a canoe journey on the Colo River and an overnight bushwalking expedition. Beyond the obvious physical challenges the boys will be particularly extended in terms of accepting real responsibility and in their personal interactions.

Some reminders:

1. Year Nine students attend in the same class group they share for **Science, Geography/History, Religious Education and PDHPE classes**
2. Please ensure that any medications for day boys are clearly labelled with your son's name, dosage and time taken and ask your son to give them to Colo staff when they arrive. If applicable please also label with any indications for use, or contraindication (when the medication should not be given). Colo staff obtain medications for boarders directly from the Health Centre.
3. Boys need to sign in at the dorms by 8.00 am as usual and will then move to the Mark St gates to start loading the bus by 8.15 am. Day boys who usually catch a Joey's bus to school will be able to catch this bus as normal.
4. The bus returns from Colo by 3.30 pm on Friday.
5. Please follow the "What to Bring" list carefully. For instance, many boys find it hard to get organized while camping if they have forgotten their torch. Please check with your son to ensure he doesn't bring anything from the "What Not to Bring" list, including food or aerosol cans.
6. Copies of the information on Colo sent previously (including the "What to Bring" list and letter to parents) can be obtained from iLearn.
7. In the week following camp a selection of photos and the Colo Bulletin, written by the boys during their camp, will also be available via iLearn.

A request:

1. In the past we have had some boys attending the camp who have been feeling slightly unwell at departure time, who have developed more pronounced symptoms over time. Unfortunately the illness has spread to others in the group. In the best interests of all students, including your son, could you please not send him to Colo if he is unwell. Similarly, if your son has an injury and is not cleared to play sport at Joeys, he is quite likely to aggravate his injury at Colo and should not attend camp. I will make every endeavour to assign your son to a camp later in the year. If you are in doubt, please feel free to contact me to discuss any concerns.

I am sure your son will enjoy his time at Colo as well as gain a lot from his experiences if he approaches the various tasks and activities with a positive attitude.

Year 9 Colo groups are the same class group as for Science, RE, PDHPE, Geography/History. Some students will be assigned to another class because of their co-curricular commitments or other special circumstances. If this is the case students will be advised of this by the Academic Coordinator.
