

## What is a Weekly Planner?

A weekly planner breaks down the available study time in the week in to 30 min blocks so you can schedule the tasks that need to be completed based on their importance after prioritising.

Note: 30 min blocks of time is the ideal amount of time to work before taking a break. If the task requires more than 30 mins, you can allocate it two blocks in your schedule but still take a break.

#### APPEAL DUE TO ILLNESS or MISADVENTURE

#### Information guide for students:

This Appeal Form should be fully completed by any student who:

- is prevented from attending a scheduled assessment task or from completing a task due for submission due to illness or unforeseen misadventure, or
- considers his performance in a scheduled task or submitted assessment work has been affected by illness or misadventure before or during the task.

It is very important to provide independent evidence with your Appeal Form. A student should seek independent evidence [e.g. current medical certificate] on the same day, either immediately before or after any assessment task for which he is appealing.

Any appeal for illness or misadventure should be submitted to the relevant Academic Coordinator immediately upon the return to school by the student following his absence due to illness or misadventure.

Following the submission of this form and all relevant documentation, the appeal will be considered by the Appeal Committee [Director of Teaching and Learning, Dean of Studies and relevant Academic Coordinator, Head of Department] who will <u>make a decision</u> and inform the student in writing of the outcome of the appeal.
